From Reverend Brent's Pastor's Corner Blog

This Summer on my sabbatical my family had the opportunity to take an extended road trip throughout the western United States. We saw many beautiful sites. If I had to choose a favorite I would have to go with May Lake in Yosemite National Park. The view there was absolutely stunning. Taking it all in with my wife and four sons was truly a privilege. What the snapshot of May Lake doesn't show is what preceded it. An hour before this picture was taken May Lake was covered by dark and angry clouds. These clouds were not content to only appear ominous. Thunder roared from them; lightning flashed. Thunder and lightning alone would not have bothered us much. What my family found disconcerting were the ¼ inch pieces of hail that rained down on us. My family got caught in the open without protection. We hid from the hail beneath a large tree. Eventually we did get tents set up, although by that point the hail had subsided anyway.

Pictures may be worth a thousand words but often the stories they tell are not very honest. We live in a society dominated by visual mediums that don't tell the full story. If I only posted the picture of May Lake on social media without the backstory many people might think I had a perfect life or at least a perfect moment with my family. This would lead some to be jealous. The truth is more complex. My family did have a wonderful moment that the picture captured. That moment only came after a time of discomfort most people would prefer to avoid. We should be careful about what we believe, even when we see evidence with our own eyes.



The purpose of this meeting is to hear and act on a recommendation from the Search Committee for a Designated Term Pastor.






