AN ADVENT CALL TO WORSHIP

Leader: Come, all who are faithful and all who seek joy in your lives. It is the season to sing praises to God for the Christ Child is near.

LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES

Reader: Through Jesus we know that God is among us. Tonight, we light the four candles on our Advent Wreath. These are the candles of Hope, Peace, Love and Joy.

Hope is the bedrock of our faith in our Divine Creator. Peace is God's gift to us, if we follow our call to serve with open hearts. Love is the blessing we can offer in faith to our suffering world; and Joy is that moment when we can stand with Jesus Christ, whose birth we celebrate this evening.

(The four candles on the outer circle of the Advent Wreath are lit.)

LIGHTING THE CHRIST CANDLE

Pastor: On this Christmas Eve, we are gathered to celebrate the birth of Jesus, the Christ, and to consider with the faithful all over the globe what His coming means to the world. As we light this Candle in his name, may its light of Grace be the healing of our entire human family and all the life that dwells with us on this planet.

(The Christ Candle in the center of the Advent Wreath is lit.)

Opening Hymn "Hark the Herald Angels Sing"

Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King: peace on earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled!" Joyful, all ye nations, rise, join the triumph of the skies; with angelic hosts proclaim, "Christ is born in Bethlehem!" Refrain:

and now it's over and done with."


Thunder in the desert!

THE SECOND LESSON Luke 1:26-38

Luke 1:26-38 The Message

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to the Galilean village of Nazareth to a virgin engaged to be married to a man descended from David. His name was Joseph, and the virgin's name, Mary. Upon entering, Gabriel greeted her:

Good morning!
You're beautiful with God's beauty,
Beautiful inside and out!
God be with you.

She was thoroughly shaken, wondering what was behind a greeting like that. But the angel assured her, "Mary, you have nothing to fear. God has a surprise for you: You will become pregnant and give birth to a son and call his name Jesus.

He will be great,

the throne of his father David;
He will rule Jacob's house forever—
no end, ever, to his kingdom."

Mary said to the angel, "But how? I've never slept with a man."

THE THIRD LESSON Luke 2: 1-20

Luke 2: 1-20 The Message

About that time Caesar Augustus ordered a census to be taken throughout the Empire. This was the first census when Quirinius was governor of Syria. Everyone had to travel to his own ancestral hometown to be accounted for. So, Joseph went from the Galilean town of Nazareth up to Bethlehem in Judah, David's town, for the census. As a descendant of David, he had to go there. He went with Mary, his fiancée, who was pregnant.

While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. She gave birth to a son, her firstborn. She wrapped him in a blanket and laid him in a manger, because there was no room in the hostel.

There were shepherds camping in the neighborhood. They had set night watches over their sheep. Suddenly, God's angel stood among them and God's glory blazed around them. They were terrified. The angel said, "Don't be afraid. I'm here to announce a great and joyful event that is meant for everybody, worldwide: A Savior has just been born in David's town, a Savior who is Messiah and Master. This is what you're to look for: a baby wrapped in a blanket and lying in a manger."

at once the angel was joined by a huge angelic choir singing God's praises:

Glory to God in the heavenly heights,

Peace to all men and women on earth who please him.

As the angel choir withdrew into heaven, the shepherds talked it over. "Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us." They left, running, and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. Seeing was believing. They told everyone they met what the angels had said about this child. All who heard the shepherds were impressed.

Mary kept all these things to herself, holding them dear, deep within herself. The shepherds returned and let loose, glorifying and praising God for everything they had heard and seen. It turned out exactly the way they'd been told!
