From the Pastor's Corner Blog

Hello All,

Rarely does a day go by in my life in which I am not picking something up off of the floor for one of my kids. One of my sons in particular seems to particularly enjoy leaving his socks all around the house. I'm not really sure what his process is. Does he just get sick of wearing socks and pull them off? Does he think I'll need these socks again later, but for now I'll just leave them sitting in the middle of the living room? The way his mind works is opaque to me.

Ann and I are trying to train our kids not to leave their socks, clothes, and other things strewn about this. Sometimes it feels like we are succeeding a bit, sometimes it feels like we have completely failed. Even when one issue no longer seems to be a problem another issue inevitably arises. We no longer have to deal with toys getting left out, but homework is often left out on our dining room table. I find the constant battle to train my kids and keep chaos at bay a bit draining. I want them to do better, and as they mature I expect they will do better. Progress is a reasonable hope, perfection is not.

There are no perfect people. If we are going to have relationships with people, we have to be patient with imperfection. If we are not, our relationships will be a source of never-ending frustration to us. It is easy to spend so much energy focusing on the frustrations that the people we love cause us that we miss out on the good aspects of our relationships. Frustrations are inherent in all relationships, we should seek to address them, while recognizing we will never eradicate them completely in this world. This is how God loves us through Jesus Christ.

Safety is always a priority at First Church Rowley

Last week, Eric installed handrails on the ramp leading to one of the side entrances.

What handrails offer:

Safety is the number one reason for any handrail to be fitted. They can quite literally be the difference between life and death.

A secure rail provides:

- A steady anchor all ages and all abilities can benefit from a securely fitted handrail. Providing stable railing not only steadies users but provides a safe and constant anchor whilst negotiating stairs.
- A barrier do you have a one-way system in place? Could central handrails help to guide workers and direct footfall? Handrails have a dual purpose. Yes, they assist people in safely navigating stairs, but they can also act as a barrier, helping to guide and control access.
- Something to grab in the event of missed footing, a trip or simply losing balance, handrails are a great safety line. Providing a secure fixing to grab hold of and reducing the risk of a serious fall. (HRKilns)


