"Why Annual Meeting is not Town Meeting"



I have served A number of churches that were the founding churches when their towns were incorporated.

Way back then before 1835, when Massachusetts ended its theocratic form of government, a new town could not incorporate until it had its meeting house built and a pastor called to serve the new parish. These rules were in place when Rowley began in 1639.

The founders did not call the church building a church. They called it a meeting house, because this space would also function as the town hall for the convening of town business Including the annual town meeting. Most often the founding deacons of the church were also the first selectmen in the town.

This always invited the temptation to confuse the secular governance with the sacred covenant.

In town meeting majority rules. In a church's annual meeting consensus and relational authenticity are first required before the group makes a decision.

This is because there is a difference between the sacred Covenant (promise) and the social contract citizens have with their state.

Covenant is living out the spirit of God's love through our human actions. Jesus never led his people by majority rule.

Last Sunday was our annual church meeting. It was a joyful and authentic time together. I truly felt at that moment we all mutually "owned" the Covenant. Never did the contest of majority rule rear its ugly head.

Because we rely on the quality of human relationship first, it is more difficult to serve in our community of faith. This is true for both staff and volunteers.

Going forward. I hope we can be sympathetic to this challenge. We must find the critical balance between avoiding conflict all together and/or getting too wrapped up in it.

Again, if we simply ask "What would Jesus do?" The Holy Spirit will lead us and help us keep the Covenant.
